### Proposed action

That the Metropolitan Council adopt the attached resolutions setting days, times and locations for regular meetings of the Council and its Committees and authorizing closed Committee meetings:

- Metropolitan Council (Resolution No. 2025-31)
- Committee of the Whole (Resolution No. 2025-32)
- Management Committee (Resolution No. 2025-33)
- Community Development Committee (Resolution No. 2025-34)
- Environment Committee (Resolution No. 2025-35)
- Transportation Committee (Resolution No. 2025-36)

### Background

The Metropolitan Council and other public bodies that are subject to the Minnesota Open Meeting Law are required to adopt a schedule of their regular meetings. (Minn. Stat. § 13D.04, subd. 1.)

As per its Bylaws, the Council establishes its regular meetings, and the regular meetings of its committees, by resolution.

The Council-adopted schedule of regular meetings of the Metropolitan Council and its Committees as set forth in the Resolutions is as follows:

- The regular meeting days for the Metropolitan Council shall be the second and fourth Wednesday of each month.
- The regular meeting days for the Committee of the Whole shall be the first and third Wednesday of each month.
- The regular meeting days for the Management Committee shall be the second and fourth Wednesday of each month.
- The regular meeting days for the Community Development Committee shall be the first and third Monday of each month; except when a meeting for a regular meeting falls on a legal holiday, in which case the immediate succeeding Tuesday shall be the meeting date for that regular meeting.

- The regular meeting days for the Environment Committee shall be the second and fourth Tuesday of each month.
- The regular meeting days for the Transportation Committee shall be the second and fourth Monday of each month.

As set forth in the Resolutions, the Council is adjusting the meeting dates for the Council, Committee of the Whole and Management Committee meetings for the remainder of 2025 and, as necessary, in the year 2026 to allow the Council to conduct its business without interruption when there are federal and state holidays, particularly during the year-end holiday season.

In addition to setting the regular dates, a resolution is required in order to make the adjusted dates “regular” meetings.

If the Council or one of its committees decides to hold a meeting at a time or place different than the time or place of a regular meeting, that meeting is a “special meeting” for which the Council must give at least three calendar days’ notice of the “date, time, place, and purpose of the [special] meeting.” Minn. Stat. § 13D.04, subd. 2(a). Agenda items for a special meeting can be removed, but business or information items not on the posted notice of the special meeting cannot be added or considered at the committee meeting.

### **Rationale**

Section 13D.04 of the Minnesota Open Meeting Law requires a public body to maintain a schedule of its regular meetings. Articles II and III of the Bylaws of the Metropolitan Council state that Council regular meetings, Committee of the whole meetings and standing committee meetings must be set by the Council by resolution.

### **Thrive lens analysis**

On Feb. 12, 2025, the Council adopted Imagine 2050, which builds on policy direction in Thrive MSP 2040. Establishing the Council and standing committee meeting schedule is necessary to ensure that Council business items are addressed in a timely manner for the Council to provide essential services and infrastructure to the seven-county metropolitan region.
