- Continued Park and Trail Acquisitions



# 2025 Acquisitions and Grants


#### Acquisitions (Green Stars - 🗙)

- 10 acquisitions across five agencies
- Approved awards in 2025 for a total of 308 .6 new acres
  - 14 acres for Regional Trails
  - 293 acres for Park Reserves
  - 1.6 acres for Special Features
- \$9,848,742 invested into these acquisitions

#### Fishing Piers Grant (Blue Triangles - ▲)

- \$500,000 appropriated by Legislature for new fishing piers
- Six agencies participated and four agencies were awarded \$125,000:
  - Carver County
  - Ramsey County
  - Saint Paul
  - Washington County

#### Imagine 2050 and Policy Plan

- Adopted Imagine 2050 Regional
   Development Guide and Regional Parks and
   Trails Policy Plan
- Created first ever Parks and Trails Planning Handbook
- Developed Park and Trail Outcome Measures
- Helped create over 180 System Statements

#### Agency-Council Workgroups

Began convening Agency staff to work through regional issues such as Trail System Coordination, Bridging Facilities, Climate and Natural Systems, and American Indian Commitments
